# Proposed Revisions to the Early Childhood Education Program 

## Rationale for Revision of the Early Childhood Education Program

The faculty in Early Childhood Education propose revisions to its current teacher education program. Each revision is presented below along its rationale.

Proposed Move from a 5-semester program, in which students begin in the spring semester Change the sophomore year, to a 4-semester program, which they would begin in the fall semester of the junior year.

Rationale In the past, the ECE program may have lost students who had not taken all the pre-requisites in time to enter program. This change also will give students more time take pre-requisite courses and/or to decide on a major. This sequence aligns the beginning of the ECE program with that of the El Ed and TAL programs.

Proposed Change pre-requisites for TEP to match those for the EL Ed and TAL programs. Change

Rationale: Having the same pre-requisites for TEP means that when it is time to select a major students can choose among the ECE or El Ed or TAL programs rather than have a restricted set of choices. Currently the ECE program has different prerequisites making it more difficult for students to change majors from El Ed or TAL to ECE.

Proposed Increased course work in special education.
Change
Rationale: The increased hours in special education will give students important content in early intervention practices so they will be better prepared to work with all young children with special needs. This also will better prepare them to work in Indiana as early interventionists or developmental therapists thus increasing career options. The increased career options could increase enrollments.

Proposed Revisions in program requirements make it easier for students to take courses Change toward the ESL or Reading certificate.

Rationale: The addition of the certificates increases students' marketability.
Proposed Reduce program hours to 120 hours.
Change
Rationale: Program will be in compliance if state mandates a maximum of 120 hours.

The Bachelor of Science in Early Childhood Education leads to a license to teach infant/toddler preschool programs and grades K-3. Course requirements for this program are valid at IUB as reflected in the School of Education Bulletin.
