Student should make an appointment with assigned Faculty Advisor soon after admission to the program.

Faculty Advisor must approve all courses taken in the program of study.

At the time of graduation, no course-work may be more than seven (7) years old.

Only one graduate workshop course (L530, W505, or other pass/fail course) may be taken for credit toward this program.

No more than nine (9) credits can be transferred from an accredited institution. Official transcripts for these courses must be submitted to Dee Outlaw, School of Education, and approved by the Faculty Advisor.

Courses accepted by the Faculty Advisor as substitutions or transfers should be noted on this form.

Students should complete an *Intent to Graduate Form* when registering for their last class in program.

Advising Reminders

First Course:

Y520 Strategies for Educational Inquiry

Schedule of Required Courses

Inquiry Courses:

The Inquiry courses should be taken in sequence:

- 1) *Y520 Strategies for Educational Inquiry* (offered every semester),
- 2) *Y510 Action Research* (offered fall semester), and
- 3) *T590 Independent Study in Urban Education* (offered spring semester). In this final course of the inquiry sequence, students will carry out action research projects in their own context.

Urban Education Courses:

Students should start taking the Urban Education courses early in their program.

- *T531 Organizational Change in Culturally and Linguistically Diverse Schools* is offered every fall semester.
 - *T550 Cultural/Community Forces & Schools*, offered spring and summer semesters, is a variable titles course. Students can take this course more than once as long as the variable titles are different.
 - *A560 Political Perspectives in Education* is offered fall semester.
 - *H530 Philosophy of Education* is offered in Summer II.
- Additional urban education seminars and courses will be available from time to time.

Teaching and Learning Courses:

All students take *P507 Assessment in Schools*. It is currently an online course offered Summer I and Summer II.

Students can choose between *J500 Instruction in the Context of Curriculum* (offered Spring and Summer II) and *L500 Instructional Issues in Language Learning* (offered Fall and Spring). (The course not taken can be counted as an elective in the Teaching and Learning area if the student wants to take both of these classes.)

Students and Faculty Advisors should decide together which four elective courses are best suited to their Program of Study.
